- 6.2.4.6.5 Other forms of scholarly or creative activity that may appear in emerging scholarly or artistic media may be included as well, provided that comparable standards of peerreview can be applied to them.
- 6.2.4.6.6 Professional activities undertaken as a practitioner or consultant are considered scholarly activity when they go beyond the routine application of knowledge to the creation of new knowledge and the development of new standards for practice. Such qualities distinguish between scholarship and professional services making the judgmentsregarding the standards for applied research necessarily involve more than clients and include academic peers familiar with the area of practiceunderconsideration.

For Africana Studies scholars, this may include ducting workshop and presentation for various organizations wishing to educate their clientele on Africana history and culture.
