Teacher Candidate Basic Skills Requirement

Regulations adopted by the tate Board of Education June 4, 2014 include basic skills requirement for teacher preparation program entry and teacher certification As of September 1, 2015:

- x Candidates starting a Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standin (CEA) educator preparation program (formerly known as "traditional route") must the basic skills requirement prior to starting coursework a program
- x Candidatesseeking an initial Certificate of Eligibility (CE) (formerly known as "alternate route") must meet the basic skills requirement prior to being issued CE except:
 - Candidates applying for CE with a career and technical educat(6nE) endorsement other than businesselated or family and consumer science endorsements we until the application for astandard certificate to meet the basic skills requirement.

Two Ways to Meet the BisicSkills Requirement

1. Pass a Commission exproved assessment of basic skills. Currently e only approved assessment is the <u>Praxis Core Academic Skill skill</u> the passing score as follows Reading: 156,

^{1.} If a candidate completed and passed the **Pre**fessional Skills Test (PPST / Praprisol) to June 2014, the Department will accept passing scores on those exams to satisfy the basic skills requirement (passing strates ST are as follows: Reading: 175, Math: 174, Writing: 173).

^{2.} Regulations allow candidates who achieved a score on the SAT, ACT or GRE that was "approximately equathindhe toppercentile score for all test takers in the year the respective was taken" to be exempt from taking the Praxis Conese cut scores represent that approximate "topind percentile score"
