
Reaction to NJ Governor Chris Christie's State of the State address January 15, 2014

Yesterday New Jersey Governor Chris Christie presented his annual State of the State address to both bodies of the state legislature. How will his suggestion of lengthening the both state's school day and school year for K-12 education be debated? And the Garden State's continual fight to bring down its crime rates is an undeniable political reality for both sides of the aisle. The State of the State speech comes less than a week after the Governor delivered his nearly two-hour apologetic press conference addressing the September 2013 traffic jam in Fort Lee, New Jersey.
