The number of travelers arrivingly casino bus, air and rail dienced in 2013. Posner and other analysts have blamed casino competition in rostretes and the lingengi effects of Hurricane Sandy for driving down arrivals Attlantic City International Airport.

Overall, the airport cared 1.1 million passengers sucheduled flights ancharters in 2013, an 18 percent drop compared to neafly million passegers in 2012.

Air travel represents the great pstential for growth in the city's vernight tourist market, Posner said. Atlantic City Internation acurrently is served by only one heduled carrier, Spirit Airlines. However, United Airlines is launiting daily flights to Atlantic City from its Chicago and Houston hubs beginning April 1.

"Arrivals via air represent a very different value Attantic City than an arrival via the road or other modes of travel," Posner said. "Air artivare much more likelto stay longer and spend more money."

Meanwhile, the number of passengers traveding asino buses fell 18 pent in 2013, to 2.1 million. Casinos have been cuttibgck on bus passengers recent years tooncentrate their marketing and promotional programs wealthier customers arriving by car.

Rail passengers were down nearly 5 percent in 2013 Transit's commuter rail line, which links Atlantic City with Philadelphia, carried about 5 million passenge last year, compared to 1.3 million in 2012, figures show.
