Stockton poll says Booker lea ds Bell by 13 points in Senate race

U.S. Sen. Cory Booker, D-Ņleads Republican challenge Bell by 13 percentage points in the U.S. Senate race, according to a pollikely voters by the Stockton Prior Institute released Wednesday.

Of the 807 respondents, 49 percent said they favok@pwhile 36 percent saidey would vote for Bell.

Twelve percent of respondents were undecided, while the remaining 3 percent preferred another candidate or declined to answer.

The poll was conducted from Sept. 5-8 and included cell phones and landlines. Its margin of error is plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

The poll also showed 59 percent of respondents hold favorable opinions of Booker, with 23 percent indicating an unfavorable view.

Bell was unknown to 37 percent of respondents, which William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy Director Daniel J. Douglas said is a mixed bag for his campaign.

"The fact that more than a third of voters ar faithiliar with Mr. Bell presents both a challenge and an opportunity for him," he said. "A 13-point difference against an incumbent in September could be encouraging to Mr. Bell, but it is offs by the lack of funds available increase his familiarity with the voting public."

Thirty-two percent of respondents said they have a favorable view of Bell, and 21 percent have an unfavorable view.

Bell, 70, was a speechwriter for Ronald Reagan asdcoressfully ran for U.S. Senate in New Jersey in 1978.
