

## **LIGHT Comments on March DGE Report**

For immediate release April 18, 2022

Comments from Jane Bokunewicz, faculty director of the Lloyd D. Levenson Institute of Gaming, Hospitality and Tourism (LIGHT), Stockton University School of Business, on March 2022 numbers released today by the Division of Gaming Enforcement:

Total single month revenue for Atlantic City casino operators in March 2022 (\$382.9 million) improved on February 2022 (\$356.7 million) by 7%, but outperformed prepandemic March 2019 (\$273.7 million) by 40%. Brick-and-mortar revenues for the month (\$216.6 million) unforTotal gross gaming revenues for casino operators in the first three months of 2022 (\$1,079.7 million) represent a new near term high, outpacing the same period in 2019 (\$726.7 million) by 49% and 2011 (\$793.9) by 36%. This performance is almost entirely driven by online and sports wagering revenues as evidenced by Casino Win (brick-and-

One indicator that has been slow to recover from the pandemic is casino employment. As the industry heads into the summer season, traditionally a period with higher demand for in-person gaming, we will begin seeing the restoration of some casino jobs in the city. But it is unlikely to result in pre-pandemic levels of employment, at least in the short term.
