## LIGHT Comments on October DGE Report

Comments f rom Jane Bokunewicz, faculty director of the Lloyd D. Le venson Institute of Gaming, H ospitality and Tourism (LIGHT), Stockton University School of Business, on October 2022 numbers released today by the Division of G aming Enforcement:

In keeping with established seasonal patterns, total and brick-and-mortar casino revenue (slots, table games and poker) for Atlantic City's casinos began to cool in October. Compared to September 2022, total gaming revenue was down 8%.

When considering the different gaming segments, monthly revenue was down 12% for brick-and-mortar, up 8.8% for internet gaming, and, despite an increase in monthly sports betting handle, down 34% for sports betting when compared to September.

Compared to October 2021, total gaming revenue for October 2022 was essentially flat increasing 1% year over year. This occurred despite a 7% year-over-year decline in brick-and-mortar gaming revenue. Internet gaming revenue for the month, which increased 1 % compared to October 2021, seems to have made up the difference. Internet
