As reported by The Press of Atlantic City following news of Demi Lovato's hospitalization Beachfest organizers, the CRDA and Live Nation, announced replacement headliners, Cheat Codes and Live July 26 concert. Fe performance was free to the public anidate holders for Ms. Lovato's performance were informed that their tickets would be honored at the July 29 performance by the Chain Smokers or refunded at the point of purchase. Sunday's performance by The Chainsmokers was the last of the 2018 beach concert series and last in the threeyear \$6 million agreement between the CRDA and Live Nation.
