

Atlantic City Tourism Performance Indicators: Casino Closings Had Mixed Impact in 3rd Quarter

2012, the month after Hurricane Sandy hit, showed a larger monthly decline. July and August parking fees were also down.

- x The Atlantic County Hotel Occupancy Fee hit a new record in August, up 10.6 percent with \$843,000, compared to \$763,000 collected the previous August.
- x In September, the Hotel Occupancy Fee fell to \$393,000, down 15.9 percent from the previous year's \$476,000. However, the gains in July and August were enough to offset this for a quarterly increase of \$100,000, or 2.9 percent over the same quarter in 2013.

"While three out of Atlantic City's 11 casinos closed in the third quarter, the city retains its position as the largest concentration of casino gaming in the United States outside of Nevada," said Dr. Israel Posner, executive director of LIGHT.
