Galloway, NJ- From the 1920s through the 1970s, the Washington family helped build and shape a vibrant and thriving African-American community in Atlantic City’s Northside neighborhood. Their story is chronicled in “Growing Up in the Other Atlantic City,” a play based on author Turiya Raheem’s book, “Growing Up in the Other Atlantic City: Wash’s and the Northside.”

The play was adapted for stage and is directed by Pamela Hendrick, professor of Theatre at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey, in collaboration with Raheem.

“Growing Up in the Other Atlantic City” will make its debut in the Experimental Theatre at Stockton College’s Performing Arts Center in February. The production will take place from **February 12-16, 2014** at the main campus, with an additional performance on **Friday, Feb. 21** at Dante Hall Theater, 14 N. Mississippi Ave. in Atlantic City.
