Dr. Wagner brings a wealth of experience in higher education administration and business education to her role leading the College’s newest and largest division.

“We are delighted Dr. Wagner will be joining us,” Stockton President Herman J. Saatkamp, Jr. said. “Beyond her strong credentials, Dr. Wagner provides expertise in strategic planning, program development and fundraising which are assets for the growth and development of the Business Division and of the College.”

The new Division of Business includes the undergraduate and graduate Business Studies programs and the Hospitality and Tourism Management program.

Dr. Wagner, who earned her doctorate of philosophy (Ph.D.) degree in Operations Research from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, served as Associate Dean of the College of Management at the University of Massachusetts, Boston. In addition to her years of experience in higher education administration at the University, Wagner was a tenured faculty member in Management Science.

She was named an American Council on Education (ACE) Fellow and in 2005-2006 worked as an ACE Fellow at the University at Albany. In this prestigious ACE appointment, Dr. Wagner was mentored by the late President, Kermit Hall. As an ACE Fellow, she worked on projects to improve course availability and lobbied successfully for a \$25 million capital project for campus revitalization at the University at Albany. She is a founding officer of SPRIG, the Spreadsheet Productivity
