Galloway Township, NJ – A big-name artist whose identity will not be announced until the night of the event tops the entertainment provided by Revel at the 33rd Annual Stockton College Scholarship Benefit Gala on Saturday, April 27, 2013 at Revel in Atlantic City.

“Don’t Call Me Francis,” a high-energy dance band also provided by Revel, will perform following the surprise entertainer’s after-dinner show. The Stockton Faculty Band will play during the cocktail hour and dinner.
