Galloway Township, NJ- The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey's Sara and Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource Center will host the Annual Ida E. King Memorial Lecture on Monday, November 23 at 7:00 p.m. in the Townsend Residential Life Center (TRLIC) located on the Galloway Township campus.

The event, free and open to the public, will feature Dr. Samuel Totten, the 2009-2010 Ida E. King Visiting Professor of Holocaust Studies. Dr. Totten will present a lecture entitled "The International Community Must Wake Up and Act in Response to Potential Genocide Early Warning Signals: Kristallnacht and Beyond," in recognition of the 71st anniversary of Kristallnacht.

Dr. Samuel Totten, a genocide scholar, has focused his energy on conducting research on present-day on-going genocide in Rwanda and Darfur. He has been appointed the 2009-2010 Ida E. King Visiting Professor of Holocaust Studies at Stockton, where he will teach undergraduate and graduate courses in addition to research projects.
