She was first sworn in as New Jersey's 169th General Assembly Speaker in January 2010. She is serving her second two-year term as Speaker.

She received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology from Lincoln University and a Master of Science degree in Planning and Administration from Columbia University. Speaker Oliver is an administrator with Essex County government and has extensive experience in nonprofit management. She has taught at several colleges and universities.

"I look forward to participating in this program and speaking with different student groups while on the Stockton campus," Speaker Oliver said.

Assemblyman Wolfe, a Senior Assistant to the President at Ocean County College, has a strong background in education. He serves on the Assembly Education Committee, which he has chaired, and on the Legislature's Joint Committee on the Public Schools. Assemblyman Wolfe is also a member of the Transportation Committee.

He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in History from Westminster College and a Masters of Education and Guidance from the University of Delaware.

A former Brick Township Council leader, he was first elected to the state Assembly from the 10th Legislative District in 1991. Reflecting his representation of coastal Ocean County, Assemblyman Wolfe has worked closely with the State Beach Erosion Commission, including as a former Chairman. The commission has developed proposals for the protection of the shore and beaches. Assemblyman Wolfe was also a sponsor of a state Blue Acres project.

"My interests in the Legislature dovetail nicely with programs and interests at Stockton College," Assemblyman Wolfe said. "I hope my time there will be mutually beneficial."

Assembly Majority Leader Louis Greenwald, D-Camden, and Sen. Chris Connors, R-Ocean, were last year's Legislators-in-Residence at Stockton.
