The Nacote Creek Rehabilitation and Upgrade Project began in the winter of 2009 and continued through the spring semester. An addition was built onto Building 501, the Teaching and Research Laboratory, nicknamed the log cabin, to increase space for larger and multiple course offerings. The computer lab was relocated and updated, an indoor seawater table was added for instructional use, the student lounge was improved, and a handicapped accessible restroom was added.
