Galloway Township, NJ- The Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) is sponsoring a yearlong series of craft workshops for older adults at the Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton College.

Diamond Frandsen, SCOSA volunteer art instructor, fiber artist/custom designer and owner of The Ivy Cottage, will teach the summer and fall workshops at the Noyes Museum, located at 733 Lily Lake Road in Oceanville (Galloway).

From the age of 9, Frandsen has woven baskets with her mother, working with reed and oak. In recent years she has been exploring the areas of mixed media baskets, including handmade paper baskets adorned with ribbon and beads. She has been using wool, felt, and yarns to make sculptures and small novelty gifts. Her work includes wool bead jewelry and woven twigs with needle felted wools to sculpt small bird's nests. As a Fiber Artist she enjoys the textures and techniques of needle felting, paper folding and embroidery. So comfortable in the art studio using all mediums of expression she creates heirloom pieces from memories of the past. "I believe that history inspires me to create for the future." Diamond holds a BA in Art Management & Art History from Stockton College.
