Dr. Laura Browder, who holds a Tyler and Alice Haynes Professorship in American Studies at the University of Virginia, is the keynote speaker. Browder is the author of *When Janey Comes Marching Home: Portraits of Women Combat Veterans*. An Army psychologist once told Browder that no one comes home from war without wounds—words that have steered Browder's mission to uncover the stories of women veterans.

"The mission of the conference is to connect these veterans with the services and benefits they have earned, which include health care, mental health, education, housing, employment and small business opportunities and grants. Emphasis will include college-adjustment issues," explained Patrick Shields, coordinator of Veteran Affairs at Stockton College.
