The program ran from October 2012 to July 2013, and included such topics as team-building, conflict resolution, and managing change and feedback. Much like the Leadership New Jersey program, it also focused on issues pertaining to Atlantic City, such as health care, poverty, public safety, the arts, economic development and education.

Joseph Lizza, assistant director of Campus Center for Operations and Programs, was recently named the Regional Coordinator & Conference Chair for the Mid-Atlantic Region of the National Association for Campus Activities ([NACA](#)). NACA is a recognized leader in higher education for providing members with innovative practices and access to programs that support campus engagement, Lizza said.
