Wendel White's Exhibit Selected for Juror's Choice Award

Distinguished Professor of Art Wendel White's "Schools for the Colored" project was recently selected for the Juror's Choice Award for the 2016 Project Launch competition at Center Sante Fe.

In the portfolio, White captures the structures and sites that operated as segregated schools, as well as open spaces where segregated schools once stood. White's portfolio preserves the architecture and geography of America's educational apartheid in the form of a system of "colored schools" within the landscape of southern New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois. The project consists of 50 framed works, and is a continuation of his "Small Towns, Black Lives" project.

"This project is intended to invoke the haunted past of segregation. Through the depiction of school
