The 40th Annual Convention of the Society for the Advancement of American Philosophy (SAAP) came to Stockton Seaview March 7-9.

"The conference involved a year of planning," said Brian K. Jackson, chief of staff in the President's Office. "We had 175 registered attendees from throughout the U.S .and from all over the world."

College President Herman J.
Saatkamp Jr., a former chair of
SAAP, had asked Jackson to work
on getting the convention here two
years ago, and Stockton's bid proposal was ultimately successful. Dr.
Saatkamp also arranged for philosopher and author Dr. Kwame
Anthony Appiah of Princeton University to be the plenary speaker.

"Each host institution has the chance to customize the illustration based on where it is being held, so we incorporated some of the Atlantic City history and iconic subjects into the illustration, which features

famous philosophers throughout history. See if you can find Dr. Saatkamp," Jackson said, noting that he worked with a graphic artist to have the president included in the event poster.

Jackson said, "The success of this conference would not have happened if not for the hard work and dedication of our host planning committee."


