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New Jersey Campus Compact's first statewide conference, "Beyond the Classroom into the Community: The Scholarship and Pedagogy of Engagement," was held Wednesday, May 29 at Raritan Valley Community College in Branchburg, NJ. The conference featured presentations from four Stockton faculty members, Dr. Reva Curry, executive director of Community Partnerships, Dr. Joseph Rubenstein, professor of Anthropology, Dr. Jennifer Barr, professor of Business Studies, and Dr. Diane Holtzman, assistant professor of Business Studies, Marketing.

Dr. Barr and Dr. Holtzman presented on how they incorporate service-learning into their courses and the importance of doing so. Two of Dr. Barr's undergraduate courses have a service-learning component, and Dr. Holtzman utilizes service-learning in both undergraduate and graduate courses.

"Through their service-learning work students gain hands-on experiences in applying what they are learning in the classroom but, more importantly, they learn more about social issues and the value of helping others in our communities," Dr. Holtzman said.

"Service-learning provides a unique opportunity to blend theory with practice while simultaneously elevating awareness among students about the challenges faced by many non-profits," Dr. Barr said. "They channel their talent and time into important community projects and build their academic portfolios in the process."
