Approval of Minutes

There is a motion to make grammatical changes to all sections of the constitution discussed in today's meeting. Motion seconded by Jessica.

Motion Passed 18-0-02*

There is a motion to amend the election section of the constitution. This change allows students the right to vote on their president and vice president once the old senate nominates the candidates. The students are also given the right to decide on the 23 senator given list candidates. **Motion seconded by Cristian.**

There is motion to amend the behavior section of the constitution. The constitution currently states, "Proper conduct must be adhered to at all times during the senator's term on student senate." The committee proposes the added definition to this section, which states, "Proper conduct varies based upon the given situation the senator is in." Also, if the executive cabinet must meet with someone based on an accusation brought against them, and are found guilty, there is currently a limited range of discipline that can be applied. Currently, the senator could not be temporarily suspended or removed from the senate due to their misconduct. The change made to this would allow the beginning of the impeachment process to take place in order to properly address the issue and make sure all accusations are addressed. **Motion seconded by Tom.**

There is a motion to amend the requirements for a senator. If a senator has been impeached, recalled, terminated for reason of absence, or resigned, they may not run for a position again. A senator who has resigned may appeal in writing to the executive cabinet in order to be exempt from this clause and avoid punishment for resigning due to personal reasons. The executive cabinet must address the appeal within two weeks. **Motion seconded by Jessica.**
